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The Carnatic Flute – about the Instrument

Carnatic Flute Anatomy

- The Carnatic Flute is made of bamboo
- One end is closed by the natural node of the bamboo
- The other end is open
- Has one blowing hole
- Has 8 holes for playing with fingers

Basic Playing

- Only 6 holes are used for basic playing
- 7th playing hole is always closed with the pinky/ little finger
- 8th playing hole is always open



- So, for basic/ practical purposes, let us consider it as a six hole flute as below (7th hole Closed & 8th hole Open)
- We could also start with a flute which has 6 playing holes, and later switch to an 8 hole Carnatic flute later, for advanced lessons





Blowing on the Flute

Start with a Pen-Cap


- Hold the pen-cap as in the picture
- Stretch your lips and make a small opening in the middle
- Now, blow downward into the Pen-cap, to make some sound
- Try this multiple times until you get good quality sound.


Now, try blowing on the Flute

- Sit straight with your back straight, Look straight
- Stretch your lips as if you are saying the letter "P". Keep your cheeks flat.
- Make a small opening in the middle of your lips
- Place the blowing hole on your lower lip, right below the blowing hole you just made (this specific shape of your lips and facial muscles is called the "Embouchure"
- Breathe in a lot of air
- Blow down using only your lips (Breathe out to the flute) as if you are saying "Pooh"
- Hold on to the blowing as long as you can
- Repeat blowing until you get a clean sound (sound quality improves and hissing noice reduces)

This link talks about blowing into a Western Metallic flute. However, blowing works exactly the same way, on a Carnatic Flute, too





Step-2: Blow into The Flute



Your first note on the flute – "Ga"

Let's play our first note (G) on the Flute

- Blow in to the flute with all holes Open
- Let's call this Note "G" (Ga in the "Sa Ri Ga Ma" scheme)
- Play and hold this note as long as you can.
 Note how many seconds you could hold say, 5 seconds
- Keep doing this for many days and you will notice this duration will increase and the Note quality will improve

Reading Notes with Commas

- When you see a "Comma" in the notation, you hold the same note for additional seconds corresponding to each comma
- For example, "G , , " You play "G" and hold it for 2 extra seconds (total 3 seconds note length)
- Now, play each line in the table below.

NOTATION	What to do	How to Read ALOUD
G	Play "G" for 1 second	Ga
G ,	Play "G" and hold the blow for 2 Seconds	Ga, Two
G,,	Play "G" and hold the blow for 3 Seconds	Ga, Two, Three
G , , ,	Play "G" and hold the blow for 4 Seconds	Ga, Two, Three, Four



Note "G" (All holes OPEN)



Notes "Ri" & "Sa"

Note "R"

- Blow in to the flute with the first hole CLOSED
- This is "R" (Ri in the "Sa Ri Ga Ma Pa Dha Ni" scheme)
- Play and hold this note as long as you can.
- Keeping the finger inclined as in the picture, is advised



Note "R" (1 hole CLOSED)

Note "S"

- Blow in to the flute with the first **TWO** holes CLOSED
- This is "S" (Sa in the "Sa Ri Ga Ma Pa Dha Ni" scheme)
- Play and hold this note as long as you can.
- Keeping the finger inclined as in the picture, is advised
- If you blow **HARDER**, you will hear a High frequency sound. This is **HIGH** Sa denoted a S (dot above)



Note "S" (2 holes CLOSED)



Basic Exercises with S, R & G

Now, let's play some Note patterns

- Blow individually for each note
- Close the holes before blowing


Holding the Carnatic Flute


LEFT HAND holding

- Traditionally, the LEFT hand fingers will be kept inclined, making a point of contact/ support between the index finger and the flute. This type of holding makes it easier to play gamakams and higher speeds
- The Thumb will be under the Flute, as a support

RIGHT HAND holding

- Close the 7th hole with the Pinky / Little Finger. On a 6 hole flute, just keep it right after the 6th hole
- Then, just place the other fingers on the flute straight (perpendicular to the flute/ not inclined)
- Thumb will be under the Flute, as a support
- Don't try to align and close the holes with finger tips. This is cause stress in fingers and will not work well. The RIGHT HAND holes are closed with/ closer to the middle section of fingers

Another Left Hand Note – "N"

Note "N"

- Blow in to the flute with the first THREE holes CLOSED
- This is the note "N" (Ni in the "Sa Ri Ga Ma Pa Dha Ni" scheme)
- Play and hold this note as long as you can.
- Keeping the finger inclined as in the picture, is advised



Points to remember

- With 3 holes closed, you will hear a sound **Lower** in frequency than "S". This is the lower frequency Ni, written as **N** (dot below) or **n** (lower case)
- Try blowing a little harder/ faster (with 3 holes closed), and you will hear a higher frequency sound (next Octave) for the same fingering. This is the **HIGH Ni** note, written as **N**
- Try playing Low (n) and High (N) notes one after the other
- Play Long, Sustained notes



Right Hand Notes - Dha & Pa

Note "D"

- Blow in to the flute with the first **FOUR** holes CLOSED
- This is "D" (Dha in the "Sa Ri Ga Ma Pa Dha Ni" scheme)
- Play and hold this note as long as you can.
- As mentioned earlier,
 - Blowing SOFTER will produce the LOW "Dha" note d
 - Blowing HARDER will produce the HIGH "Dha" note "D"



Note "P"

- Blow in to the flute with the first **FIVE** holes CLOSED
- This is "**P**" (**Pa** in the "Sa Ri Ga Ma Pa Dha Ni" scheme)
- Play and hold this note as long as you can.
- As mentioned earlier,
 - Blowing SOFTER will produce the LOW "Pa" note p
 - Blowing HARDER will produce the HIGH "Pa" note "P"





Play the Notes N, D & P

n , , , (blow <mark>Soft</mark>)	 Close all holes tightly. Blow SOFT to produce the note "n"
N , , , (blow <mark>Hard</mark>)	 Close all holes tightly. Blow HARD to produce the note "N"
d , , , (blow <mark>Soft</mark>)	 Close all holes tightly. Blow SOFT to produce the note "d"
D , , , (blow <mark>Hard)</mark>	 Close all holes tightly. Blow HARD to produce the note "D"
p , , , (blow <mark>Soft</mark>)	 Close all holes tightly. Blow SOFT to produce the note "p"
P , , , (blow <mark>Hard</mark>)	 Close all holes tightly. Blow HARD to produce the note "P"



Tips for Easy blowing and Good Note Quality

Tips for Good Blowing

- Sit Straight, Look Straight and Blow Downward
- Stretch your lips as you would say the letter "P". Do not make a round share (O) with your lips
- Keep your cheeks flat, we won't blow using our whole mouth
- Blow using only your lips in a smooth, NARROW air stream. Blow as if you would say "Pooh"

Tips for Good Note Quality

- Close the holes first, and then blow (closing and blowing should not be done together, as closing might come later affecting sound production)
- Focus on Closing the LEFT hand holes tightly while playing any note
- Take fresh air and blow individually for each note (Breathe IN, breathe OUT to the Flute)
- Feel the edge/ rim of holes on all closed fingers
- Feel the vibration of air/ flute on all closed fingers
- Play LONG Notes
- Keep Sruthi ON (Sruthi E for a 3/ E Flute) while playing which will give a good support to playing better

Hot Cross Buns

- Play the note in each column for 1 second
- If you see a comma, hold the previous note for one more second For example, S, (total 2 seconds)
- When you see two notes together, each note takes half a second. For example SS takes total 1 second

Another Song – Mary had a Little Lamb

Mary Had a Little Lamb

- Play the note in each column for 1 second
- If you see a comma, hold the previous note for one more second
- "P" is the **High** note "Pa"
- S,,, Play "S" and hold it for 3 more seconds

Note "Ma"

- Close ALL holes EXCEPT the FIRST one and blow. This is the note "M" ("Ma" in the "Sa Ri Ga Ma Pa Dha Ni scheme)
 - On a 8 hole Carnatic flute, the 1st and 8th (last) holes will be **OPEN**
 - The 7th (Pinky) hole will be CLOSED
- This is the HIGH "M". LOW "m" fingering is different which will be discussed at a later stage of learning
